

Dear Mr. Caton:

As requested by Ms. Radika Karmarkar of the Policy and Program Planning Division of the Common Carrier Bureau, the NYNEX Telephone Companies¹ (NYNEX) hereby amend and provide supplemental information to their Customized Announcement Services (CAS) Comparably Efficient Interconnection (CEI) Plan which was filed with the Commission on July 28, 1995 and further explained in NYNEX's Ex Parte Letter filed on December 6, 1995. NYNEX is amending its plans to use Access to Customer Premises Announcement (ACPA), a feature associated with NYNEX's Automatic Call Distribution (ACD) service, to interconnect its CAS recording equipment. Under the Open Network Architecture framework, ACPA would be considered a Basic Service Element (BSE). NYNEX's Automatic Call Distribution (ACD) service would typically be obtained by the end user customer and would therefore be considered a Complimentary Network Service (CNS). Both ACD and ACPA are underlying basic services associated with NYNEX's Centrex service which is an intrastate local exchange service. ACD and ACPA are technically incompatible with existing access arrangements in the federal jurisdiction since they are intrinsically associated with local exchange Centrex Service.
